



Request for Cure

Pursuant to 30 ILCS 500/50-57, the Chief Procurement Officer for General Services may, at the request of the State Purchasing Officer and agency head, permit a cure during an active procurement if a violation or deficiency of the Procurement Code, or of the procurement rules, regulations, policies, or practices promulgated by a chief procurement officer occurs.

Instructions for Submission: Complete sections 1-3. The State Purchasing Officer should provide the "Request for Cure" form to the Chief Procurement Officer with documentation as needed to support the request.

Dynex Technologies was not registered with the Board of Elections at the time of bid opening per 30 ILCS 500/20-160 (c) of the Illinois Procurement Code.

2. Justification to Cure the Violation or Deficiency

Provide a detailed explanation why the benefits of permitting a cure outweigh the potential harm to stakeholders.

This product has been solicited twice. During the first solicitation, Dynex submitted a quote incorrectly and additional vendors did not quote compliant equipment. This led to the first bid being canceled due to no responsive bidders. In the second solicitation, Dynex was the only vendor to submit a quote that met the specifications in the solicitation; however, they were not registered with the Board of Elections at the time of their bid. Given that Dynex is the only vendor to quote the technical requirements, resoliciting the procurement a third time would be unlikely to produce additional qualified bidders and would result in unnecessary delays. There is no harm to stakeholders, as the products proposed do not meet the specifications listed in the IFB. The agency relies on this product for critical, ongoing operations, and further postponement would pose operational risks and could interrupt service delivery. For these reasons, it is in the best interest of the agency to allow this vendor to cure their registration with the Board of Elections.

3. Recommended Action Necessary to Cure the Violation or Deficiency

Provide a clear description of the action necessary to cure the violation or deficiency, including the party(ies) that will undertake the action and the time frame to complete each action.

The agency is requesting that the requirement for Board of Elections registration at the time of bid opening be excused. Dynex has since completed its registration, and excusing this requirement will allow the agency to proceed with the procurement from the only vendor who quoted the specifications, while maintaining continuity of operations and ensuring fiscal-year compliance. The ELISA machine is to replace a Tecan machine that is consistently needing repairs and is limited on vendors to perform maintenance on.
